

PVRI 2027 Bangkok Abstract Guidelines

- Abstracts should be uploaded in English through PVRI's EventsAir abstract portal pvri.eventsair.com/pvri2027/abstracts and should be no more than 300 words. Once submitted, you will receive a confirmation email.
- Figures or tables are not allowed.
- The names of all authors and affiliated institutions must be written in English in full and uploaded under the Authors and Affiliations section of the abstract portal. Authors' names should be labelled with numbers to match their affiliations.
- The abstract title, authors and institutions are not included in the word count.
- All correspondence relating to abstracts will be undertaken by email with the submitting author. It is their responsibility to communicate any relevant information regarding the submitted abstract and the Congress to the other authors.
- There are 5 themes for the PVRI 2027 Bangkok meeting. When submitting your abstract, please indicate the theme that best fits your abstract; however, please note that the organisers may amend the category without notice.
 1. Basic & Translational Science
 2. Clinical Science
 3. International & Global Health
 4. Mind the Gap: Cases that Highlight Gaps in Evidence
 5. Next-Generation Diagnostics, AI & Therapies
- We are delighted to offer seven Best Early Career Abstract Travel Awards for the best abstracts, in addition to the Rupert Swift Award and the Butrous Foundation Young Investigator Award. Please indicate when submitting if you want your abstract to be considered for an award. Late-breaking abstracts are not eligible for the awards.
- All submitted abstracts may be considered for an oral presentation in our main Congress programme.
- The accuracy of the submitted abstract is the responsibility of the authors. **You should prepare and proofread your abstract carefully before submitting** to ensure it is the final version.
- The text version of all accepted abstracts will be published in our journal, *Pulmonary Circulation*, and may appear on the PVRI website. If you do not want your abstract published, do not check the yes box during the submission process.
- There is no fee for abstract submission, but **you must have a [current PVRI membership to submit](#)**. PVRI is committed to making membership accessible to the widest possible global community. Membership fees are significantly discounted for early career professionals and members living in low- and middle-income countries, helping ensure that financial barriers do not prevent participation in the global pulmonary hypertension community.

Criteria for late-breaking abstracts

Late-breaking abstracts should report highly impactful, novel findings that became available after the regular abstract submission deadline and are expected to substantially advance the diagnosis, management, or understanding of pulmonary vascular disease. Priority will be given to first presentations of major clinical trials, landmark registry analyses, transformative translational discoveries, and emerging technologies with immediate clinical relevance

- 5 October 2026: Abstract submissions close
- 12 – 26 October 2026: Reviewer scoring window
- 30 October 2026: Final scientific committee abstract awards decision
- 02 November 2026: Notifications sent

- Dec - Jan 2027: Portal opened for presenter confirmation

- 06 November 2026: Late-breaking abstract submissions open
- 30 November 2026: Late-breaking abstract submissions close
- 1 - 8 December 2026: Rapid review
